The Rector's Corner

Dear Brothers and Sisters of St. Michael's,

A week ago tomorrow, a hurricane changed our area in so many ways. I do not have to tell you all that. All of us have stories, some are quite harrowing. We have navigated Covid. This parish has navigated being without a priest for an extended amount of time. I believe we will navigate these repercussions for weeks, months, and even years. But we will not go it alone. We will navigate these things together and with God. When we do not have the words to pray or to give comfort, we look to our Book of Common Prayer (1979). In it are prayers for a variety of situations. Below is a prayer entitled For All Sorts and Conditions of Men. I invite us all to reflect on it.

O God, the creator and preserver of all mankind, we humbly beseech thee for all sorts and conditions of men; that thou wouldest be pleased to make thy ways known unto them, thy saving health unto all nations. More especially we pray for thy holy Church universal; that it may be so guided and governed by thy good Spirit, that all who profess and call themselves Christians may be led into the way of truth, and hold the faith in unity of spirit, in the bond of peace, and in righteousness of life. Finally, we commend to thy fatherly goodness all those who are in any ways afflicted or distressed, in mind, body, or estate; [especially for all those beset by Hurricane Helene]; that it may please thee to comfort and relieve them according to their several necessities, giving them patience under their sufferings, and a happy issue out of all their afflictions. And this we beg for Jesus Christ's sake. Amen. (BCP 814)
