It is my understanding that this is our highest total to date. My thanks to Rick Parnell and Marie Miller and the whole committee who took our talents and placed them in the right places. It will be a joy and honor to send these funds back into the community as we love our neighbors. One final note about the Oyster Roast. Mosely Hardy took lots of pictures.

As a reminder, we continue with our Lenten Study – Bridging Lent to Easter. In this discussion, we study the Gospel lessons in Lent (video and discussion). On Wednesdays, we have our Healing Service at 11 AM and then the class roughly ten minutes later. Plus, we have a brief Order of Evening Worship at 5:30 and then the class. On Fridays, we have Stations of the Cross at 5 PM. This service is a quiet one that traces Jesus' steps from Pilate to the Cross and the Tomb. It is a great spiritual discipline (something to consider to take on in Lent instead of refraining from something).

On Sundays, we will use the Penitential Order (Confession at the beginning of the service), Prayers of the People (Form IV), Eucharistic Prayer C (which has the Lenten invitation to "Return to God"), and a Lenten Solemn Prayer instead of a blessing. At this time, Nancy Owens has broken her left hand. Tomorrow, she will have surgery. Let us all keep her and Ken in prayer. Consequently, our music might be reduced some.

However, given the Lenten season, it is appropriate to have "muted" worship. When you come to church on Sunday, see if you notice anything different in the Nave... Speaking of music, thanks for responding well to The Great Litany!

Finally, we will have a Commissioning of Candidates during The Peace at our 10:30 AM Service. Ethan Carroll will be our candidate for Happening (March 21-23) and Sheree Chapman will be our candidate for Cursillo (March 27-March 30). Cursillo and Happening are spiritual renewal events for adults and youth, respectfully. Please hold them both in prayer.

Have a great week everyone. I pray all of us are now used to Daylight Savings Time. I'll see you at church!

**LENTEN SEASON:** Please remember that alleluias are omitted from the Liturgy during the Lenten Season, as this is a pertinent time and our worship is muted. After we celebrate the Resurrection of our Lord, we will return to including alleluias in our Worship.

**LENT WORSHIP:** As we are in Lent, we will use the Penitential Order (BCP 352) and Eucharistic Prayer C (BCP 369). This Sunday 3/16, we will use The Decalogue (BCP 350). The aim of using these offerings is to enhance our Lenten experience and use as much of the Prayer Book as possible within a year.

**LENTEN STUDY**: We will have a video and discussion of the upcoming Gospel lessons during Lent. We will have our 11 AM Healing Service and class following that service. At 5:30 PM, we will have brief worship and the same class for those who are unable to make it earlier in the day. Come and try these worship and education opportunities.

**STATIONS OF THE CROSS**: While Stations of the Cross have been done on Good Friday only, this year we will offer them each Friday in Lent in the Church at 5 PM. This is a quiet, though powerful, spiritual discipline. We will have Stations on Good Friday as in previous years. With any questions, please see Fr. Dan.
