In the life of The Church, this Sunday is Lent 4. It is known as Laetare. Of this Sunday, the Episcopal Church Glossary says, "[t]he church is called to joyful anticipation of the victory to be won. This joyful theme provides lightening from the penitential emphasis of Lent." We are headed into two weeks of the hopefulness that is Jesus Christ. It is my hope that you will notice that our lessons will have a more joyful and hopeful theme than previous Sundays. This will help us "gird" ourselves for the challenge and joy that is Holy Week and Easter.

As we get closer to Holy Week and as a reminder, in The Episcopal Church, we have our general confession in our service. During Lent, it will be at the beginning of the service. But, did you know that The Episcopal Church has individual confession? It is known as Reconciliation of a Penitent (BCP 446) and is designed for someone who has the Holy Spirit working on them with a particular sin that needs to be named, confessed, and absolved.

With Reconciliation of a Penitent, remember, it is "All may, some should, and none must..." If you feel nudged by the Holy Spirit, I invite folks to look at Form II, pray about it, and then reach out to me.

Have a great week everyone. Please pray for our neighbors to our north in Pickens, Greenville, and Transylvania Counties. Pray these forest fires come under control and there is no loss of life and no significant loss of property. At this time, I am unaware of an "Episcopal Church Response" concerning the fires. If you know of any relief work, please reach out to me. Again, let us pray for mercy concerning these fires.

At 5:30 PM, we will have brief worship and then the same class for those who are unable to make it earlier in the day. Come and try these worship and education opportunities.

STATIONS OF THE CROSS: While Stations of the Cross have been done on Good Friday only, this year we will offer them each Friday in Lent in the Church at 5 PM. This is a quiet, though powerful, spiritual discipline. We will have Stations on Good Friday also.

APRIL ECM: will be a Fish Fry on Thursday, April 3 at 6:30 PM Social 7:00 PM meal. Please sign up in the Parish Hall, so we know how much food to prepare. Invite someone who hasn't been to a meeting.

ECW SPRING HIGH TEA: Our 5th Annual Spring High Tea will be held Saturday, April 12th from 12:00 to 2:00 in the Parish Hall. Dress in your Sunday best, Hats preferred but not required.
